WILL OF JOHN EVERETT, RECORDED JULY 12th, 1828.

In the name of God, Amen,

I, John Everett of the State of Georgia, and County of Bulloch, being in perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows to wit:-

1st,-I give and bequeath after my just debts are paid, all my proerty both real and personal that remains at my deceased unto my beloved wife Sarah Everett to hold and enjoy during her natural life or widowhood.

2nd,- I will and desire that at the marriage or death of the said Sarah-Everett, that the whole of the above mentioned property be divided into Seven equal shares or parts; with the exception of such property as I have already disposed of or may hereafter dispose of either by deed or otherwise, which said prty or shares shall belong to the following heirs, Viz. Joshua Everett, Josiah Everett, Aaron Everett, John Everett- and my daughter Hannahs two children John and Sarah to have ~~#####~~ one of said shares- Lastly I constitute and appoint my Sons Joshua, Jehu and Aaron Everett, my executors to this my last will and testament, Utterly disallowing any other form of will by me made ratifying this as my last will and testament,-

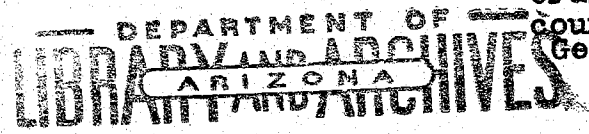

Will of John Everett, Decd.

I John Everett of the County of Washington and State of Alabama having a numerous of children, for which I am desirous of providing to the extent of my means therefor to secure to them of my property as I wish they should have do make and declare this my last will and Testament.

1st. I give and devise to my son Enoch Everett Eighty acres of land lying in Clarke County State of Mississippi, Also our negro boy named Amos and one horse saddle and bridle and one bed and furniture All of which he has heretofore received.

2nd. I give to Ebeneza Slade who married my daughter Elmira Everett which is now dead One horse & saddle One bed and furniture all of which he has received and is to be his entire portion of my Estate.

3rd. I give and devise to my daughter Polly Berry Moore ~~one~~ Bed and furniture and one saddle which she has received and I hereby Constitute and appoint my son John Everett Executive Trustee for the purpose of conveying a certain portion of my Will into effect as well as to secure to my daughter the use and labor of certain slaves which I intend to bequeath to the lawful heirs of my said daughters. And I hereby give to the said John Everett Trustee a certain negro Girl named Fanny and a negro boy named Jack for the use and benefit of the said Polly Berry Moore during her natural life and after the death of the said Polly Berry the said negroes are to be equally divided the lawful heirs of the said Polly Berry and they shall inherit the same in fee simple.

4th I give and devise to my daughter Sarah Toomy One horse and saddle and one Bed and furniture which she has Received. and to my said Trustee I give 3 negroes girls named as follows Rose, Allivia and Joanna and my Trustee is hereby directed to let my said daughter Sarah have the use and labor of said negroes during her natural life time and after death the said negro girls Rose. Allivia and Joanna and all the issues are to be equally divided amongst the children of the said Sarah Toomy and they shall inherit the same in fee simple.

5th. I give to my son John B. Everett one negro woman named

Venus and one negro girl named Dianishia and their future increase together with one hundred Dollars in money or its Equivalent.

6th. I give and devise to my son Bridges I Everett one negro woman named Tobitha and her two daughters Sirina and Edna.

7th. I give and devise to my son John Everett one negro boy named Ebbis and girl named Annelky and one hundred Dollars in money or its equivalent.

8th. I give and devise to my son Joshua Everett a negro girl named Lorana and one named Any and also a tract of land lying and being in Washington County and State of Alabama, designated as follows. The South west quarter of Section 25 of Township 9 of Range 5 West all its appurtenances, this is all my Estate which I intend he shall have.

9th. I give and devise to my son Bazzil Everett a negro boy named Harry and a girl named Franky.

10th. I give and devise to my son Joshua a negro woman named Ellen her increase and a negro boy named John Dunuñ and after this marriage or death of my wife he is to have the half quarter Section of land where I now Reside.

11th. I give and devise to my daughter Rachael Ann Everett One negro girl named Grace and one named Florence Hasty, and one named Lugenia and a horse Bridle & saddle or its equivalent One hundred Dollars.

12th. I give and devise to my son Daniel Everett one negro boy named Anthony and one named Richard and a boy named Isaac designated by the name of left hand and a quarter Section of land known by the name of the Clanton Field where the letters DE are marked on the corner trees and horse Bridle and saddle worth 60 or 70 Dollars and after settling all my just debts out of this remaining portions of my estate. It is my will that the Ballance of my estate both Real and personal furniture and tools of all kinds remain for the use of my wife during her natural life time or widowhood not to be sold or deeded away under any condition whatever and at her death or marriage I direct that the whole of the portions left for her use and benefit be equally divided among the following named heirs, viz: Enoch Everett,

Bridges I Everett, John Everett, Bazzil Everett, Josuah Everett, David Everett Everett, Polly B. Moore, Sarah M. Toomy and Rachael Ann Everett and a work entitled The National Portrait Gallery I bequeath to my nephew John Everett because I know he will read them and I hereby nominate and constitute the above said John Everett my nephew the sole Executor of this my last will and Testament Signed sealed and Published by the said John Everett as his last will and Testament in the presence of us who are called on by the said Testator to Witness the same this 7th day of October 1846.
